Dulled: made less sharp or effective.

Fancy: thoughts, especially very imaginative ones.

Mad: insane, crazy.

Foresight: The ability to anticipate future events with careful planning.

Lantern: a portable protective case for a light such as a candle.

Triumph: the joy felt when someone succeeds or wins.

Deeds: actions.

Awe: an emotion that reflects a combination of amazement, fear, and wonder.

Pitied: (past tense of pity); to sympathize; to feel sadness because of another's pain or trouble.

Vain: not successful; unproductive, or fruitless.

Stalked: (past tense of stalk); to follow someone secretly, with great stealth

Enveloped: (past tense of envelope); to cover completely.

Crevice: a long, narrow opening.

Furious: very angry.

Refrained: (past tense of refrain); to have held back from doing something.

Anxiety: an uneasy feeling that something unpleasant is going to occur; a feeling of dread.

Shrieked: (past tense of shriek); to have screamed in a sharp and piercing way.

Hastily: quickly and carelessly.

Pale: lightness of skin tone due to worry or fear.
